















































































COMMITTAL:

Words of Remembrance: Michael Pietroboni

Bruna was born on 23rd March, 1920, to parents Luigi and Amabiglia Gavioli in Commune di Ostiglia, Provincia di Mantova in Italy. Her given name was Dolpha Bruna Gavioli. Bruna was 1 of 13 children. She came to Australia when she was 8 years old in 1928 with her family. They settled in Cairns where she met Paul Pietroboni and they were happily married in 1938. They had 2 children: Sergio in 1939 and Mary in 1941. They travelled to Griffith in 1946 for a holiday to see Antenore, Bruna's brother and never left. They lived on a farm in Hanwood, then in Griffith and then finally moving to Yenda and purchasing Farm 1488 Cemetery Road. This would be her beloved home for the next 50 years. It was a 25acre fruit salad farm. Bruna worked hard on the farm, they were hard times. Bruna was house and garden proud she loved her vegetable garden and flowers.

Bruna was a great seamstress and would make most of her clothes and for Sergio and Mary. She enjoyed knitting and Crocheting, she was a good cook and they enjoyed the simple things and her family was her blessing. She has a much loved dog, Trixie, then a little dog called Honey.

Mary married Angie in 1964 and they had 3 sons: Neil, Kieran and Darren.

Sergio married Frances in 1967 and they had 3 children: Michael, Phillip & Eliza.

Her beloved Paul passed away in 1982 and Bruna remained on the farm for many years enjoying her garden, veges and family gatherings which she loved.

In 2000, her son Sergio, tragically passed away and it was a sad time for all.

Bruna moved to the Yenda Retirement Centre in 2002 and then the Griffith Legacy Units in 2010 and remained there until 2019. She had her license and drove her car until she was 99.

In November 2019 she moved to Scalabrini Village where she turned 100 and celebrated life. She made the front page of The Area News and received her letter from the Queen which she loved.

Bruna loved the colour pink, crosswords and red wine. She was happy, spirited, witty and most of all she loved a chat.

Bruna has 6 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren.

We will all treasure the memories and love her dearly.
