

Dancing In The Sky

Edone Luciano Borgnolo was born on the 6th of January 1938 on a fruit farm in Hanwood to Vittorio and Iolanda Borgnolo. He had an older sister, Elba Piazza. Nonno came into this world born in the house that would eventually become the home where he would raise his own family with Nonna. Nonno grew up, lived and worked on the farm for 56 years before retiring and moving to Griffith.

Throughout his life, Nonno worked hard on the farm, after school as a young boy and in his teens where he attended evening classes at TAFE to learn welding. Nonno often worked on New Year's Day to keep the farm running and said if you did that, you would be working every day of the year.

In November 1964 Nonno met the love of his life Carmela at a soccer game in Hanwood. They married in April 1965 and had two daughters Alison and Vicki. Nonno often talked about his dates with Nonna where her brothers and sisters accompanied them to the movies and would bring cans of tuna to save money on food.

Nonno was proud to see his daughters marry and start families of their own. He was ecstatic when he became a grandfather to Claire, Nathan, Brendan, Damien, Brianna and myself. Nonno had a great love, generosity, kindness and a unique sense of humour. This included being a great storyteller and he would often tell stories about growing up in Hanwood, the mischief he would get into with his sister, his cousins in Sydney and in northern Italy. Nonno put so much effort in telling his stories to make people laugh. Just when you thought Nonno had no more stories to tell, he would find a new one. Elba, his late sister encouraged him to write a book of his stories but he was not convinced as he said it would have to be called the 'Book of Disasters.'


For example, when Claire was young, she asked Nonno why he was bald. Nonno told her that one day he was bending down in his vegetable garden when a goat came along and ate all the hair on his head. Another fond memory my cousins have about Nonno is when they were sitting around the dinner table and Nonno was balancing a hardboiled egg on his fork. Nathan burst a balloon which frightened Nonno and the egg went flying making my cousins laugh.

Nonno loved the great outdoors especially the beach, camping and fishing with the whole family whenever he would get the opportunity. He loved anything Australian, especially country music by Chad Morgan and Slim Dusty, singing his favourite songs at the top of his voice while he disced the farm. The staff at Scalabrini Village soon discovered this when he became a resident as Nonno would often encourage them to sing along.

He loved making things out of steel and wood and regularly attended the men's shed at Scalabrini Village. Nonno was quite the inventor, making things to make farm work easier. Sometimes they didn't always work out like the twelve-horsepower carrot slicer he made that scatted pieces of carrot everywhere.

Even though his family and relatives couldn't always be together, Nonno was happiest when we were able to spend time together, either on holidays or sharing a meal and glass of wine around the dinner table. Nonno, we will all miss you dearly. God holds you in his hands, and you will remain forever in our hearts.
