

Eppie had so many friends, she had an infectious laugh and big, gorgeous smile and she couldn't go by without a chat.

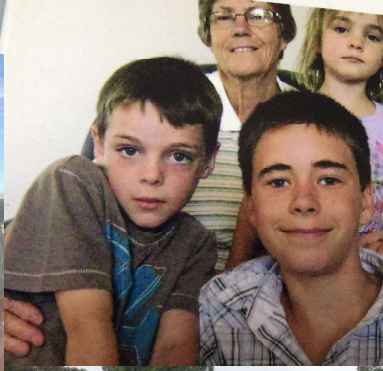

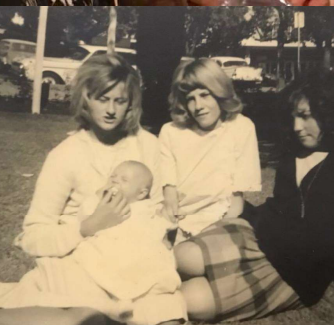
