

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Psalm 23, read by

The Lord is my shepherd: There is nothing I shall want. He will make me to lie down in green pastures; and lead me beside still waters

He will refresh my soul: and lead me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: For you are with me, your rod and staff, they comfort me.

You spread a table before me: in the presence of all those who trouble me: You have anointed my head with oil, and my cup overflows. Surely your goodness and loving kindness will follow me all the days of my life:
And I shall dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Second Reading: John 6.35-40, read by

Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe. Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away; for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me. And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day.'

Please stand.

Holy and loving Father,
by your mighty power you gave us life,
and by your love you have given us new life in Christ Jesus.
We entrust Gordon to your merciful keeping:
in the faith of Jesus Christ,
who died and rose again to save us,
and who now lives and reigns with you
and the Holy Spirit in glory forever. Amen

May he rest in Peace, and rise in glory, Amen.

Please remain standing, as the coffin is taken from the Church.
