Many people in Griffith have citizenship certificates or awards where Jim has used his calligraphy talents and enjoyed his calligraphy lessons at Western Riverina Community College.


All: Thank you Jim for learning calligraphy and sharing it.


All: Thanks you Jim for your enthusiasm for music.

**All**: Thankyou Jim for your life, a fruitful, loving and talented shared life









