The Lighting of the Paschal Candle: Lewis Quarisa
Fr Thomas: In Baptism Mary received the light of Christ.
This light has guided and inspired her throughout her life.
All: May Christ, the eternal and unfading light,
now welcome Mary home into the Kingdom of Light and Peace.

The Aspersing (Sprinkling with Holy Water): Joe Quarisa
Fr Thomas: In the waters of Baptism, Mary died with Christ and rose with him into new life.
All: May she now share in Christ's eternal glory.

The Placing of the Funeral Pall: Frank Quarisa

Fr Thomas: On the day of Baptism, Mary was robed with Christ, sharing his royal inheritance.

By her life and example, she has lived with Christian dignity and humility. **All:** May Christ now enfold her in love, and bring her into her eternal inheritance.

Placing of the Wheat: Giacinto Quarisa

Fr Thomas: Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground, it remains but a single grain, but, once buried, it shall spring forth into abundance of life. **All:** May our sister Mary become a new creation.

A wooden spoon for her love of cooking and providing for her family. A sheath of rice for her life as a farmer and her hard work and determination. The Ministry of The Word

First Reading: Ecclesiastes 3.1-14 Read by Aleisha Quarisa

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. What gain have the workers from their toil? I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover, he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil.
